We have experienced the power of five loaves and two fish time and time again, as shown by our partner, Crossroads Church, donating funds in the fall of 2018 for a double cab pick-up truck for our Kwa-Zulu Natal projects. It has been an incredible help to the work that we are doing. 2018 ended with a few more blessings that, along with the truck, significantly helped get our projects in Kwa-Zulu Natal off the ground and running. Thanks to local donations, we built our second preschool. And this time, we do mean built it. It's not a container. The area is too remote to get a shipping container to the site. We also hosted our very first team in Kwa-Zulu Natal over Thanksgiving. It would be one of many to come. And about February of 2019, we received a shipping container filled with food from Crossroads Church's 2018 Thanksgiving Food Drive. He always takes care of our needs.

This year has been no different. God continues to provide. Hosting nine teams, over 200 amazing people, has kept us busy! Those hands have advanced the purpose and the projects of Build The Future by leaps and bounds. We had many firsts! In May was our first motorcycle trip - a team landed in Johannesburg and rode motorcycles to our projects to Kwa-Zulu Natal. It was a life-changing trip for many! Our first education-based trip, filled with teachers who held workshops for our teachers at all our projects and some additional local teachers we invited in. October brought our first medical team to Kya Sand, who ran a clinic for our students and their families. We are so grateful for these new opportunities but are equally excited for the many teams who came in-between. You worked in the garden, ran new irrigation lines, painted new containers to make our schools fun and friendly for the kids, helped pack meals with Rise Against Hunger, fixed lunches, passed out food parcels, spent time in classrooms, encouraged our teachers, played with and loved our kids, and so much more.

None of us could have ever imagined the year we've had, yet there was more! In June of 2019, Build the Future USA launched and began taking donations. They are a U.S. based 501c3 that specifically supports the work we are doing, and the response has been overwhelming. We cannot thank you enough. You keep us hopeful and dreaming of what's next.

In June, we also began a new partnership with Afrika Adventures to manage trips exclusively with Build The Future. We are excited that they will not only be able to manage our trips with our ministry partner, Crossroads Church, but with new partners as well. They can plan a trip for a small group of friends or teams from churches and organizations and anywhere in-between. We look forward to adding to our trip offerings.

Build the Future currently operates in two areas of South Africa — Johannesburg and Durban. Near Johannesburg, we run a feeding program in Soweto and a preschool in the informal settlement of Kya Sand. The preschool has around 100 students and serves students through kindergarten. We have two+ preschools, a makers market, and a teaching garden near Durban in Ndwedwe. There are plans for a new site in KwaZulu-Natal, with a container preschool and farming project.

Build the Future's container preschools are our "foot-in-the-door" of the community. Not only do we get these young, often vulnerable children off the street where they can be fed three times a day and provided early childhood learning, we also hire our teachers and staff from the community, providing jobs. We offer our preschool teachers opportunities to become trained and certified, providing a career advancement path and higher salaries.

We serve the school-age children in our communities, often feeding them on school holidays, providing homework support centers, and weekend programs. Where possible, Build the Future partners with the local primary schools, creating mutually beneficial and reciprocal relationships. We also support our preschoolers' parents, creating opportunities to volunteer to help with tuition and attend educational events just for them.

We have gardens that provide food for the schools.

Particularly in Ndwedwe, Build the Future is a training ground for people in the community to come to learn and become certified in growing food. This allows them to sustain themselves and enable them to provide an income for their families. And the sharing of knowledge continues to grow; those that become trained then teach others how to garden. Community farming begins.




